DESCRIPTION.

HEtype wheel has 46 letters, figures and points, (everything necessary to write anything desired) on the outer edge (B) and an index, (C) on the inner edge, so that the operator can readily tell where the letters are. In writing, the operator revolves the wheel (either way) by means of the knob, (A) until the desired letter is opposite the printing point, (D) and presses the wheel down, the printing point fitting into the notch in wheel opposite the desired letter. The foot spring raises the wheel to its former position when the operation is repeated as with all other typewriters. The inking Roll, (H) keeps the letters well supplied with ink and Pawl, operating on the notched bar at rear of maching spaces automatically after each letter is printed. A fooleasy sheet may be printed, which is inserted under the ratchet bar, and if desired a sheet A MILE LONG may be printed. A steel spring (E) holds the paper firmly and the frame holding wheel slides with perfect freedom on a pollshed steel bar. The other parts are of finished hard brass. The ink roll is of the finest felt and held against the type by a delicate spring. A brass shell filled with ink is furnished with each machine together with full and explicit directions for use. It is packed in a strong wooden case, to insure delivery in good order.
